FAITH in WHAT ? (The object)

Object:

- That to which the mind is directed
 - to attain <u>ultimate purpose</u>, <u>peace or joy</u> etc
- That which excite emotion, affection or passion

In the Old Testament, the object of faith is Jesus Christ. (WHO?)

In the New Testament, the object of faith is the BLOOD of Jesus Christ. (WHAT HE DID?)



GRACE

Perish:

- To be wasted or rendered useless. Jeremiah 9:12.
- To be injured or **tormented**. 1 Corinthians 8:11.

Luk 13:3 I tell you, Nay: but, **except ye repent**, ye shall all likewise **perish**.

Joh 10:28 And I give unto them **eternal life**; and they shall **never perish**, neither shall any *man* pluck them out of my hand.

Joh 3:15 That whosoever <u>believeth</u> in him should <u>not perish</u>, but have <u>eternal life</u>.

Joh 3:16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever **believeth** in him should **not perish**, but have **everlasting life**.

Mat 5:29 And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast *it* from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should **perish**, and **not** *that* thy whole body should be cast into hell.

2Pe 3:9 The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, <u>not willing that any should perish</u>, but that <u>all should come to repentance</u>.

Redeem:

- To purchase back or <u>pay the penalty</u>
 - · For sin and the violation of God's law
 - by paying an equivalent (a life for a life)
- To free by making atonement (reparation)

1Pet 1:18-19 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not <u>redeemed</u> with corruptible things, **as silver and gold, from your vain conversation** received by tradition from your fathers; But <u>with the precious blood of Christ</u>, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

Heb 9:11-12 But Christ being come an high priest ...but **by his own blood** he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained **eternal redemption for us**.

Heb 9:26 ...but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.

Atonement:

- reconciliation, after enmity Romans 5:11.
- <u>reparation</u> made <u>by</u> giving <u>an equivalent</u> for an injury

Christianity is the only religion with forgiveness of sin:

Jesus died for our sins – He paid the penalty by an equivalent – **A LIFE FOR A LIFE**

Because of WHAT Jesus did, God forgave the sins of everyone who believes this is truth.

Forgiveness:

- The pardon of an offender, by which he is <u>considered and treated</u> as not guilty.
- Remission of a debt, fine or penalty.
- Intercede to <u>stop the coming blow</u>.

1Jn 1:7 ...and **the blood of Jesus Christ** his Son <u>cleanseth us from all sin.</u>

Rev 1:5 ...Unto him (Jesus) that loved us, and <u>washed us from our sins in his own blood,</u>

OUR RESPONSIBILITY:

Repent from our sinful life
Turn to God
Believe in God

Heb 11:6 But without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him.

Rom 3:28 Therefore we conclude that <u>a man is justified by faith</u> without the deeds of the law.

Heb 10:23 Let us **hold fast** the profession of **our faith** without wavering; (for He *is* faithful that promised;)
