

Heb 1:1 God, who at <u>sundry times</u> (1) and in <u>divers</u> manners (2) spake in <u>time past</u> (3) unto the <u>fathers</u> (4) by the <u>prophets</u> (5),

Heb 1:2 Hath in these <u>last days</u> (6) spoken unto us by *his* <u>Son</u> (7), whom he hath appointed <u>heir of all</u> things (8), by whom also he made the worlds;(9) Heb 1:3 Who being the <u>brightness of *his* glory</u>,(10) and the <u>express image of his person</u>,(11) and <u>upholding all things</u> (12) by <u>the word of his</u> <u>power</u>,(13) when he had by himself <u>purged our</u> <u>sins</u>(14), <u>sat down on the right hand</u> (15) of the <u>Majesty on high</u>;(16)

- 1. Many portions, many times, and in many ways
- 2. Many manners
- 3. Of old / former times
- 4. Male ancestors
- 5. An interpreter of oracles or other hidden things the OT prophets, having foretold the kingdom, deeds and death, of Jesus the Messiah.
- 6. Last referring to time
- 7. Kinship child
- 8. in Messianic usage, one who receives his allotted possession by right of sonship: so of Christ, all things being subjected to his sway,
- 9. To create
- 10.Of Christ in that he perfectly reflects the majesty of God
- 11. Splendour, brightness that which belongs to God absolute perfection of the deity
- 12.God the Son the preserver of the universe keep from falling
- 13. His omnipotent command / instruction
- 14. Cleansing from the guilt of sins wrought by the sacrifice of Christ
- 15.a place of honour or authority
- 16.made higher than the heavens Christ raised to the right hand of God,

- Heb 1:4 Being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by <u>inheritance</u> (1) obtained a more <u>excellent name</u> (2) than they.
- Heb 1:5 For unto which of the angels said he at any time, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee? And again, I will be to him a Father, and he shall be to me a Son? (3)
- Heb 1:6 And again, when he bringeth in the <u>firstbegotten</u> (4) into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God <u>worship</u> (5) him.
- Heb 1:7 And of the angels he saith, Who maketh his angels <u>spirits</u> (6), and his <u>ministers a flame of fire.(7)</u>
- Heb 1:8 But unto the Son *he saith,* Thy throne, O God, *is* for ever and ever: a <u>sceptre of righteousness</u> (8) *is* the sceptre of <u>thy kingdom</u> (9)

- 1. To receive the portion assigned to one / to partake of eternal salvation in the Messiah's kingdom
- 2. More surpassing
- 3. Father of Jesus Christ, as one whom God has united to himself in the closest bond of love and intimacy, made acquainted with his purposes, appointed to explain and carry out among men the plan of salvation, and made to share also in his own divine nature
- 4. Christ, the first born of all creation
- Kneeling and bowing before God and the ascended Christ - fear mingled with respect and affection directed to the Supreme Being; reverential worship;
- 6. a movement of air hence, the wind itself,
- 7. one busied with holy things, eg priest those by whom God administers his affairs and executes his decrees: so of angels
- 8. indicates the severest, most rigorous, rule; hence equivalent to a royal scepter an impartial and righteous government
- 9. royal power, kingship, dominion, rule of the royal power of Jesus as the triumphant Messiah

- Heb 1:9 Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity (1); therefore God, even thy God, hath anointed (2) thee with the oil of gladness (3) above thy fellows.
- Heb 1:10 And, Thou, Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the works of thine hands:
- Heb 1:11 They shall perish; but thou remainest; and they all shall wax old as doth a garment;
- Heb 1:12 And as a <u>vesture</u> (4) shalt thou fold them up, and they shall be changed: but thou art the same, and thy years shall not <u>fail</u>. (5)
- Heb 1:13 But to which of the angels said he at any time, Sit on my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy <u>footstool</u>? (6)
- Heb 1:14 Are they not all <u>ministering</u> (7) spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation?

- Contempt and violation of law, iniquity, wickedness
- 2. Consecrating Jesus to the Messianic office, and furnishing him with the necessary powers for its administration
- 3. exultation, extreme joy, gladness an emblem of the divine power and majesty to which the Son of God has been exalted.
- 4. a covering a mantle
- 5. to leave off, cease, stop
- 6. to subject, to reduce under one's power metaphor taken from the practice of conquerors who placed their feet on the necks of their conquered enemies
